### **Key issues**

- 1. In accordance with the provisions of subsections 75(1) and 76B(1) of the Anti-Money Laundering and Terrorism Financing Act 2006 (AML/CTF Act), the AUSTRAC CEO must maintain registers known as the Remittance Sector Register (RSR) and Digital Currency Exchange Register (DCER). Subsections 75(4)(b) and 76B(4) provide that the AML/CTF Rules may make provision for and in relation to the publication of the RSR and DCER in whole or part, or of specified information entered on the RSR or DCER.
- 2. In October 2011, the AUSTRAC CEO approved the publication of the RSR on the AUSTRAC .e .vebsite .sR remains i Peleesed by Australia Peleesed by Australia website and the relevant content was made available on the website in 2012. This followed a public consultation process. A searchable version of the RSR remains available to the
